This week we plan to have a test, as well as complete Lesson 80 and Investigation #8.

We're convinced that having Math 5 and 6 separately this year has been a positive development for the students. We can actively teach the concepts to our students, and have time to assist them as they're working. However, as outside teachers, we don't have the luxury of occasionally finding an extra 15 minutes for our students to work on their math homework. We also haven't been able to schedule weekly tests on Friday, in order to minimize homework on the weekends. Consequently, most of our students have homework on a daily and weekend basis. We appreciate parental oversight making sure that the homework is completed.


One more thing: It will be helpful to know that we will be doing Investigation 8 on Wednesday, February 26th. Our practice has been to go through these particular lessons as a class and if your child will be absent, please ensure that he or she goes through the material independently. 6th grade students will be focusing on geometric construction of bisectors (a compass & ruler will be needed) and 5th grade will be graphing points on a coordinate plane.

In completing our Bible course, the end of unit test required the students to summarize the Bible's main thread as discussed by Malachi concerning Jacob and Esau. Many students responded similarly to this answer below:

"In the beginning, the ancestors of all mankind, Adam and Eve, turned away from God and sinned against Him. This act of sin plunged the entire human race into sin, and we are all tainted from it. God, being just, requires that sin be punished with the eternal flame of hell. But, in His lovingkindness, He appointed a group of people to be saved. In order to save His children, He sent His perfect Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross. This death washed all of God's children's sins away, and now when we confess our sins, He looks at us as though we never had nor committed any sin: we are perfect in His eyes. This act of incomprehensible love makes me willing and ready every day to love and serve Him with all my heart, soul, and mind, for the rest of my life and all eternity."

Don't you just love that response!

With term 3 just around the corner, our course curriculum ramps up a notch. I often remind students that they need to spend the School Handbook recommendation of 70 mins per day on working through their assignment work to stay on top. This time of the year is the bottleneck part of the year. It can be compared to the struggle of a butterfly as it exits its cocoon: it must go through the pain of the narrow opening in order to enter the big wide world and survive. May the Lord provide the necessary strength and stamina for the road ahead.

Our Bible lessons have switched gears now. The main program from now on is Church History, but every Friday we're going to meet as class in a discussion forum to discuss the scheduled bible chapter. We started with Acts chapter 1 this past Friday, and because this week Friday is Mid Winter break, next week Friday we will discuss Acts 2. Please see the schedule below.

Each child must prepare themselves for the Friday discussion. They need to read the bible chapter before Friday, as well as think of a question for the class to discuss. There will be assignment questions that they need to answer and hand in on that day also. These assignments are all posted in the Google Classroom. Two eighth grade students will present a short essay on various verses for the chapter; and one student will be the chairperson!
