

Calling all moms: we need one more to join us on our Warm Beach Field trip.

Have you heard about Shadow and Jackie? They are proud dad and mom eagles caring for their eaglets. They live in the Big Bear Valley in the San Bernardino Mountains of Southern California. We have a small section dedicated to their livestream on our massive interactive screen in our classroom, and it's been a fascinating watch as they feed and care for their young. It stands as a clear and beautiful testimony to the Lord's almighty and ever present hand in His amazing creation. It also is a wonderful testimony that there is no confusion in the animal kingdom as far as gender goes, and as far as the roles of dad and mum looking after their family. A quick search will put you into an exhilarating bird watch mode:) "O LORD, our Lord, How excellent is Your name in all the earth."

In our Church History lessons we examined the effects and influences of the Enlightenment on theologians such as Dr Geelkerken and Dr Kuyper, as well as the power that gripped Synod causing hierarchy, in response to Dr Geelkerken's preaching on the first few chapters of Genesis. Perhaps you have wondered whether the structure we have in our reformed churches of Council - classis - regional synod and General synod is actually a hierarchical system! We say that the Roman Catholic church has a hierarchical system, and that's because each part of the hierarchy rules above each section below it. The Pope is the supreme hierarchical ruling authority over the Roman Catholic church. Each level in the Reformed context serves the church through an advisory capacity, **not** in a ruling capacity. And so anything that comes on the classis table, all the way up to Synod, is put there by the churches for the churches, and each "level" acts as an advisory "committee" to the churches. The local church Council is the single most autonomous ruling authority under Christ, given by our Lord, over His Bride, the Church. In response to Geelkerken, Synod acted in a hierarchical manner as it ruled to depose Geelkerken and his whole consistory! They indeed had the right intentions, but went about it in the wrong way.

Soon we're going to begin our unit on speeches! Everyone needs to present a speech on a topic of their choice. It would be helpful for you to prompt your child into speech making mode:)
