It's remarkable how quickly time passes—the days are noticeably shorter than just a few weeks ago. Despite the prevailing "darkness" of winter, the light of God's Word made flesh radiates brightly in our hearts and lives, dispelling the darkness.

Talking about the light of the Gospel, two Handel's Messiah concerts will be performed in our church on Northwood Road this weekend. While many attribute the oratorio's composition to Handel, it was actually Charles Jennens who provided the scriptural text for Handel to write the musical compositions. Together, they created a profound musical testament to the gospel message: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

As we enter the festive season, my hope is that the light of the gospel will penetrate the hearts of those living in spiritual darkness. Even amid beautifully decorated Christmas trees and twinkling displays, many may find their joy to be fleeting. My prayer is that we would walk as children of Light, allowing others to see the light that we radiate and ultimately glorify our Father in heaven.

The students recently proposed conducting a "secret Santa" during the last week before Christmas. This initiative adds a wonderful dimension to our classroom culture, and it's always heartening to see how students demonstrate kindness toward one another. I accepted their proposal, with the students suggesting a \$15 gift limit. With many students having some pocket money, it would be most kind and meaningful if they paid for it themselves! Tomorrow, the students are required to memorize the 23 helping verbs. They've been tasked with learning them through a creative approach—be it a song, poem, story, rap, or game. While I mentioned this would be an extra credit assignment, it is mandatory for all students to complete it.
